

3-D Painting

With Pop-Up Hidden Image

How To Do It:

Materials Needed: Vellum Bristol color copies exactly the same size - 2 per project, Tacky Glue, (optional) light weight cardstock for stand, Pop-Up pattern template, markers or pens, scissors, small pieces of packing styrofoam to elevate the Pop-Up.

* glue paper parts onto cardboard backing or use vellum bristol

1. Sign your name on the reverse side.
2. Trim away excess to desired size. Cut & position photo stand on back side, even with bottom edge.
3. Using template, trace and cut out the Pop-Up image from the second color copy. Set aside.
5. Glue small piece of styrofoam packing to back side of Pop-Up image. (this elevates the image)
6. Match position exactly & glue remaining side of the styrofoam Pop-Up to the large color photo image.

Now you can easily see the hidden image
Salvador Dalí painted!

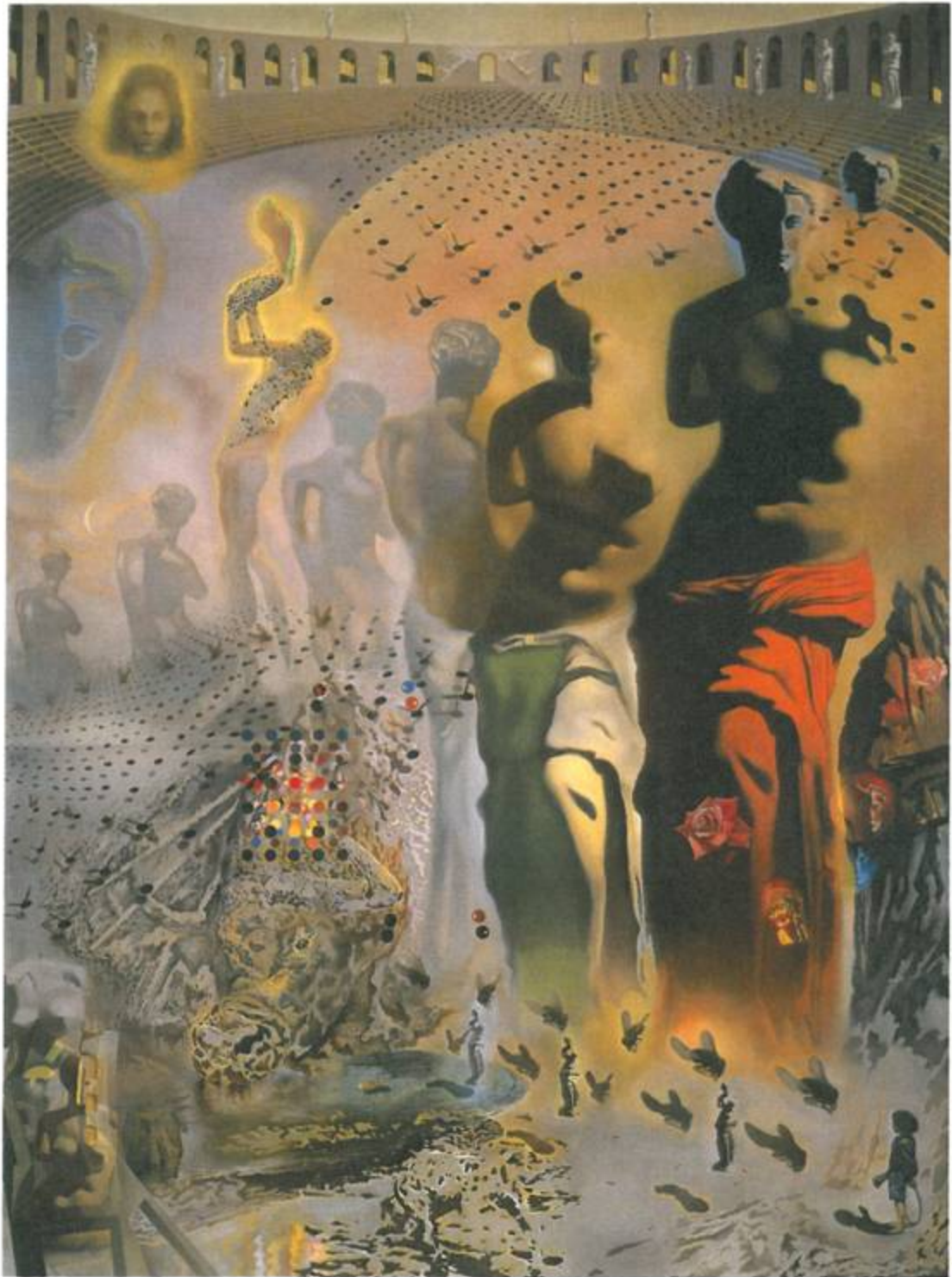
The Craft as it relates to Salvador Dalí:

Salvador Dalí is very famous for painting hidden images in his paintings. Can you name another Dalí hidden image painting you have seen in our Museum?

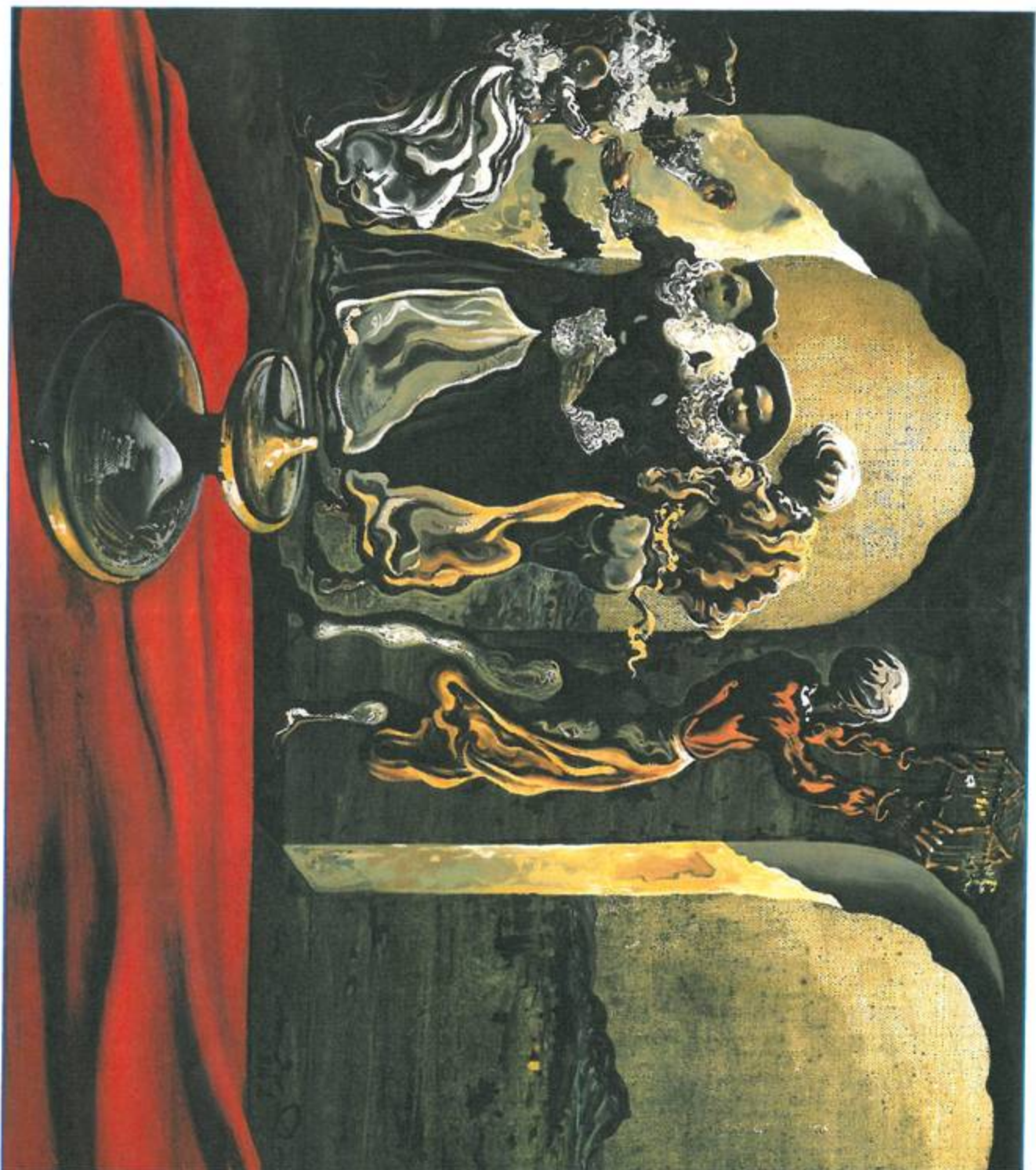

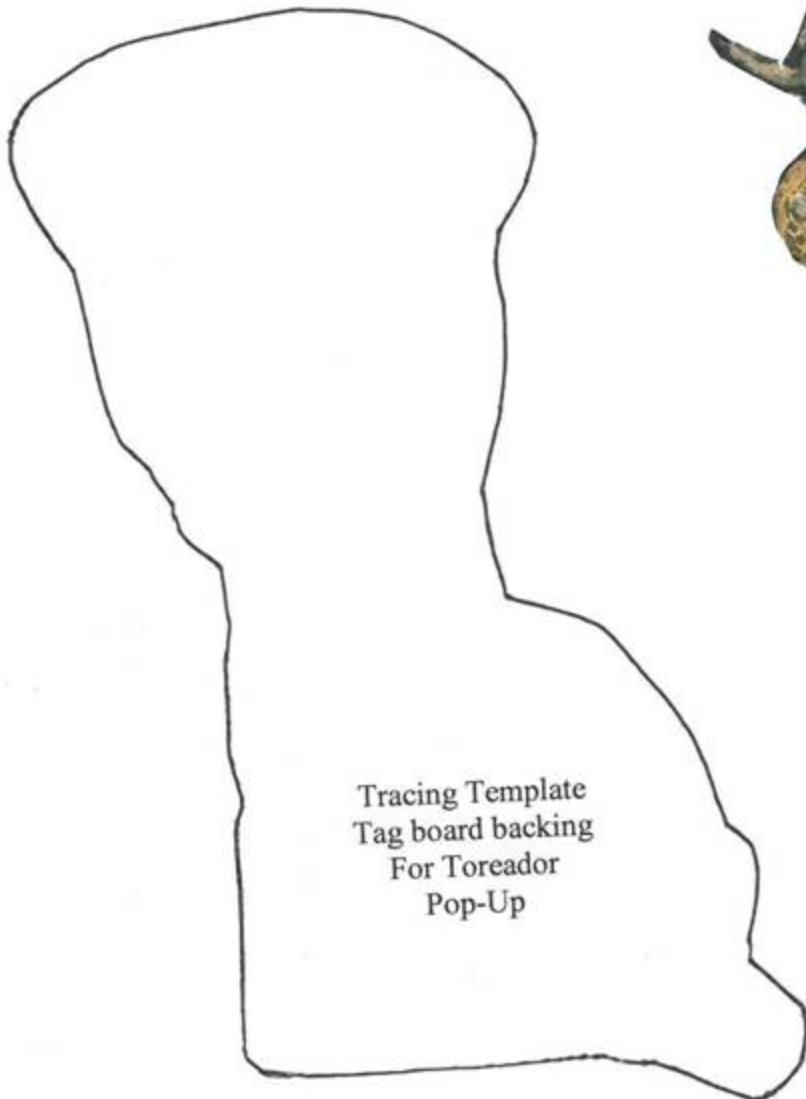




Hallucinogenic Toreador, Oil on Canvas, 1969-70
